

OFE Growers Newsletter for August 25, 2022

This week was the first week of the 5th grade math and science garden program. Our first meeting was an orientation to the gardens. The students were organized into teams. A student team leader was chosen and was accompanied by 1 or 2 volunteers to guide the day's efforts. The class visited the Orchard Gardens before proceeding to the Main Garden area where stations were set up. The individual teams visited each of the stations hearing about what goes on in that area. The stations included a composting area where compost is made, the main shed where the tools and supplies are kept, the main garden with its 16 raised beds, and a work area for the harvest to be weighed and prepared for distribution to the class at the end of the day. Garden and tool safety was also discussed in the outdoor classroom. The students and volunteers had a good time together and we all seemed ready to have some good gardening fun.

Each week an OFE Growers Newsletter will be presented to the school to be included in the school's newsletter (Falcon Focus or Bulletin Board). This newsletter is made available so that the parents and their children can read about what we did in the gardens that week. Each Thursday will be a gardening day, but because of the numbers of students we will be working with 1/3 of the students in the 5th grade class each week so we will have a new class lesson every 4th week.
